As you are aware, our national song "Vande Mataram", by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee is believed to have been written during the auspicious occasion of Akshaya Navami, which in 1875 was on 7th November. Vande Mataram first appeared in the literary journal Bangadarshan as part of his novel Anandamath in a serialised manner and later as a standalone book in 1882. During that period, India was undergoing major social, cultural and political changes, and there was a growing consciousness of national identity and resistance to colonial rule. The song, invoking the Motherland as the embodiment of strength, prosperity and divinity, gave poetic expression to India's awakening spirit of unity and self-respect. It soon became an enduring symbol of devotion to the nation.

- 2. The popularity of Vande Mataram grew rapidly in the late 19th and early 20th centuries. On 24th January 1950, while announcing the adoption of the Constitution, Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the First President of independent India and also as President of the Constituent Assembly, stated that the song Vande Mataram, which had played a historic part in the struggle for India's freedom, shall be honoured equally with Jana Gana Mana and have equal status with it. Since Independence, Vande Mataram has continued to hold a place of special honour in official ceremonies, public events and educational institutions, representing the ideals of patriotism, unity and service to the nation.
- 3. In recognition of its historic importance and national significance, the Union Cabinet, chaired by the Hon'ble Prime Minister on 1st October 2025 approved the nationwide celebrations to mark 150 years of the national song, Vande Mataram. The commemoration provides an opportunity to highlight the contribution of Bankim Chandra Chatterjee and to reaffirm the values of unity, sacrifice and love for the Motherland that the song embodies.
- In the above context, Government of India has decided to commemorate 150 Years of Vande Mataram through year-long commemorative activities across the country from 7th November 2025 to 7th November 2026. The commemorative activities and action plan has been approved by the National Implementation Committee on 24th October 2025.
- 5. Further, in accordance with the directions of the National Implementation Committee (NIC), it is requested that all Ministries and Departments of the Government of India are encouraged to actively participate in this national campaign and contribute towards making the commemoration truly meaningful and inclusive. The indicative list of activities that can be done by your Ministry/Department under this commemoration are highlighted in Annexure 1.
- In this regard, it is requested to nominate a Nodal Officer from your Ministry/Department to coordinate with the Ministry of Culture for effective implementation to commemorate 150 Years of Vande Mataram.
